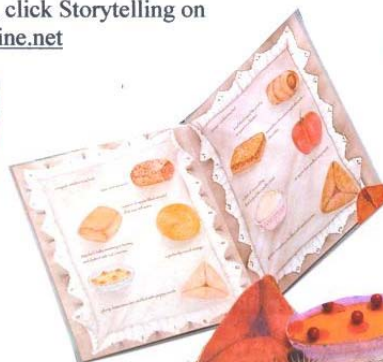
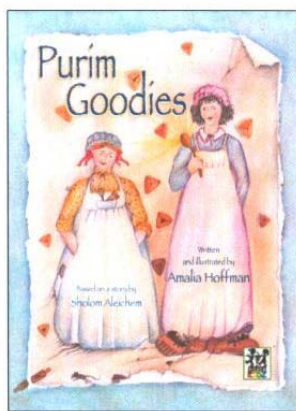

It's easy to understand why the two maids in the story just had to have a *Stikaleh* (little piece) to nibble on when they were sent to deliver the goodies to two prominent families...

After the performance, learn how to prepare *Hamantaschen* for baking as Amalia demonstrate how to roll the dough with a rolling pin and make the triangle shape cookie.

of *The Klezmer Bunch*



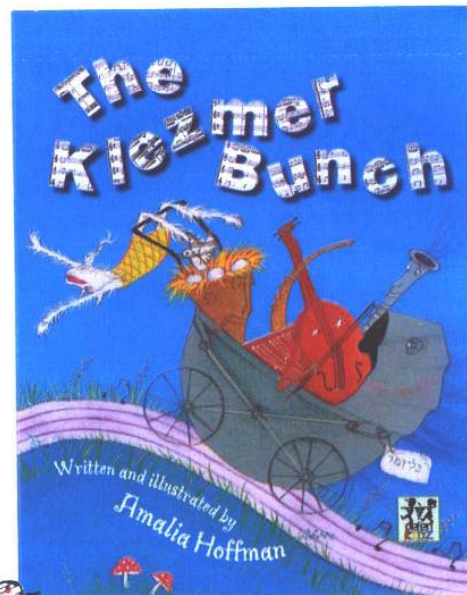
A unique and fun filled event for the entire family.

Listen to the sounds of the traditional musical instruments used in klezmer music: the fiddle, clarinet, saxophone and tsimbl.

After the presentation, young and old get up to dance klezmer style, just like the guests at the wedding in Tarnopolska.
